

Unapproved Minutes
City of Eskridge
Regular City Council Meeting
November 25, 2013

The regular meeting of the Eskridge City Council was called to order by Council President Bill Cook at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Bill Cook, Melissa Corley, Cindy Kraus, and Justin Rush. Deann Williams and Tim Wines were absent.

C. Kraus moved, seconded by J. Rush to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

M. Corley moved, seconded by C. Kraus to approve the minutes of November 12, 2013 as written. Motion passed unanimously.

J. Rush moved, seconded by M. Corley to approve additions to Appropriation Ordinance #1396. Motion passed with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Work orders were reviewed. The 2002 Chevy pickup has coolant leak from the water pump assembly. Maple Hill Truck and Auto estimates it will cost \$368.00 to repair. M. Corley moved, seconded by J. Rush to approve the repair. Motion passed unanimously.

A request to purchase 4 new tires for the bob cat was considered. The council had questions regarding the purchase and in the absence of Drew Kemp, the decision was tabled until additional information is obtained.

At 7:10 p.m. Mayor Deann Williams arrived and presided over the meeting.

At this time Resolution 112513-1 was presented. The resolution orders the structures and other debris at 402 East 1st Street be demolished and that any costs incurred will be assessed against the owner and the property as allowed by City Code. M. Corley moved, seconded by C. Kraus to adopt Resolution 112513-1. Motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 112513-2 was reviewed. This resolution declares the property at 406 Bellvue Avenue to be in violation of City Code 8-509. This is a violation of the minimum housing code. At this time J. Rush moved, seconded by B. Cook to adopt Resolution 112513-2 and set a hearing for Monday, January 13, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall at which time the property owner can appear to show cause. Motion passed unanimously.

At this time the council reviewed the applications received for the pending job opening. After examining the candidates, the date of December 16th was set to hold interviews. The clerk was instructed to contact the individuals and set times.

At 7:40 p.m. being no further business to conduct, B. Cook moved, seconded by M. Corley to adjourn. Motion passed unanimously.
