

Unapproved Minutes  
City of Eskridge  
Regular City Council Meeting  
April 8, 2013

The regular meeting of the Eskridge City Council was called to order by Mayor Deann Williams at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call was answered by Bill Cook, Melissa Corley, Cindy Kraus, and Justin Rush.

B. Cook moved, seconded by C. Kraus to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

M. Corley moved, seconded by C. Kraus to approve the minutes of March 25, 2013 as written. Motion passed unanimously.

M. Corley moved, seconded by C. Kraus to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1389. Motion passed with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Drew Kemp gave his department report.

The contracts to begin work on the natural gas pipeline to Lake Wabaunsee have been prepared by Kramer Consulting, LLC and examined by attorney Todd Luckman. J. Rush moved, seconded by B. Cook to authorize the mayor to sign the contract and to issue the notice to proceed to BRB Contractors. Motion passed unanimously. The preliminary start date for the project is April 15<sup>th</sup>.

Kansas Municipal Utilities is requesting the city select two voting delegates. B. Cook moved, seconded by C. Kraus to appoint Joe Mercer and Justin Rush. Motion passed unanimously.

Election results were received from Jennifer Savage, County Election Officer. Deann Williams was elected as Mayor. Cindy Kraus and Tim Wines were elected as council members. Tim will take office at the next meeting, April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Under mayor and council concerns, B. Cook brought up the subject of the replacement of the public docks. Discussion included the location and design. Bill will obtain an up to date cost estimate. This will be an agenda item on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Mayor Williams asked for an executive session.

At 7:23 p.m. C. Kraus moved, seconded by M. Corley to go into executive session for 5 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel with the Mayor and Drew Kemp present. Motion passed unanimously.

At 7:28 p.m. the open meeting convened.

At 7:30 p.m. being no further business to discuss, B. Cook moved, seconded by J. Rush to adjourn. Motion passed unanimously.
